Educators are able to increase their flexibility and accessibility of instruction, for all students, through the three UDL components of (a) multiple representations of content, (b) multiple forms of expression, and (c) multiple options for engagement (HEOA, 2008; National Center on Universal Design for Learning, 2014).

Person-Centered Planning (PCP) is a method of helping individuals focus on their unique needs and goals for the future and developing a plan of action to reach those goals. PCP is grounded in an inclusive philosophy.

With the individual as the focus, solutions are crafted to fit their needs and goals rather than fitting the individual into the service or program goals.



This process is a required project component to access Mini-Grants funds through the FCIHE.

Students with intellectual disabilities, enrolled in CTP certified programs, are eligible for federal financial assistance such as scholarships, work study, and Pell grants.

Annual Hartwick Symposium
