

SEDNET Referrals Broward Top 5 Answers

- 1. SEDNET Referral is **NOT** a Change of Placement.
- 2. SEDNET Referral only says take an **EXPEDITED** look at the student.
- 3. If a school is already working on reviews of the student, *DO NOT*STOP.
- 4. <u>NOT ALL BAKER ACTS</u> result in a SEDNET Referral, but it is an opportunity for follow up.
- 5. SEDNET is **NOT** a program.

Updates: SEDNET Region 9, SEDNET Palm Beach County



- Facilitate transitions between residential facilities and district schools
- > Follow up after Baker Acts with schools and families
- > Collaboration and coordination with foster care liaison and child welfare agencies
- Collaboration with community agencies
- > Technical Assistance for schools in areas of social emotional learning and behavior
- Facilitate training:
 - Youth Mental Health First Aid (YMHFA)
 - Trauma Informed Care School and Community
 - Functional Behavior Assessment/Behavior Intervention Plans
 - Prevention/De-escalation Training



Create own Water Globe/Bottle

SEDNET

- Clear Bottle
- Fill with water or use an 8 or 16.9 oz bottle (empty out a little)
- Make sure it does not leak
 (secure it for students with glue or super secure tage)
- Use plastic
- Put sand or glitter inside (not too small or too large)
- Shake it up and
- Label it
- Describe the activity: Use it in many ways
 - Help to use until you are calm
 - Use as a timer
 - Self Regulation and Self Help
